MUNICIPAL NPDES Refresher Illicit Discharge BMPs Spill Response

NPDES is the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. Whew! Just think 'Clean Water Act'.

Illicit Discharge – any discharge not comprised entirely of stormwater. May be construction, commercial, industrial or residential in nature.

The material may be anything that causes a problem.





*This is called turbid water.










Problem Hoses

This was described as 'Biodegradable Degreaser'. If it doesn't degrade into stormwater, it may NOT go into a storm system. Private systems are linked to County systems; violations can occur on private property!

This is dirt tracked from a construction site onto municipal road. Call this in to **Natural** Resources 533-8135

Reportable Spill > 25 gallons


On pavement
