RESOLUTION 2022-1

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE RIVER LANDING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT CONFIRMING AND APPROVING THE ACTIONS OF THE CHAIRMAN AND DISTRICT STAFF REGARDING THE ACQUISITION OF CERTAIN RIVER LANDING PHASE 1B UTILITIES AND CONVEYANCE OF RIVER LANDING PHASE 1B UTILITIES TO PASCO COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND ADDRESSING SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the River Landing Community Development District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government created and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the District to construct, acquire, operate, and maintain public infrastructure improvements; and

WHEREAS, the District has adopted an improvement plan for the planning, design, acquisition, construction, and installation of certain infrastructure improvements, facilities, and services within and without the boundaries of the District and specifically relating to the area known as River Landing Phase 1B, which plan is detailed in the *Master Engineer's Report*, dated July 2020, as supplemented by the *Supplemental Engineer's Report*, dated October 2020 ("Capital Improvement Program"); and

WHEREAS, the District has authorized an *Acquisition Agreement*, dated August 28, 2020, with Taylor Morrison of Florida, Inc. ("**Developer**") which sets forth the process by which the District may acquire the improvements comprising the Capital Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has advanced, funded, commenced, and completed certain Phase 1B utilities located within the plat known as "River Landing Phase 1B", recorded in Plat Book 86, Page 22, of the Official Records of Pasco County, Florida ("Utilities"); and

WHEREAS, the District desires to confirm and approve all actions of the District Chairman and District Staff regarding the acquisition of the Utilities and subsequent conveyance of the Utilities to the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE RIVER LANDING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. The acquisition of the Utilities, the execution of documents relating to such acquisition of the Utilities, the conveyance of the Utilities to the County, and all actions taken in the furtherance of the acquisition and conveyance of the Utilities, are hereby declared and affirmed as being in the best interests of the District and are hereby approved and confirmed by the Board.

SECTION 2. If any provision of this Resolution is held to be illegal or invalid, the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

At this time, the River Landing Community Development District ("**District**") is acquiring certain utilities improvements and related work product ("**Acquired Improvements and Work Product**") located in Phase 1B from the Developer pursuant to the *Acquisition Agreement*, dated August 28, 2020. Upon acquisition, the District will convey the Acquired Utilities by Bill of Sale to Pasco County for ownership, operation and maintenance. Here are the improvements and work product being funded:

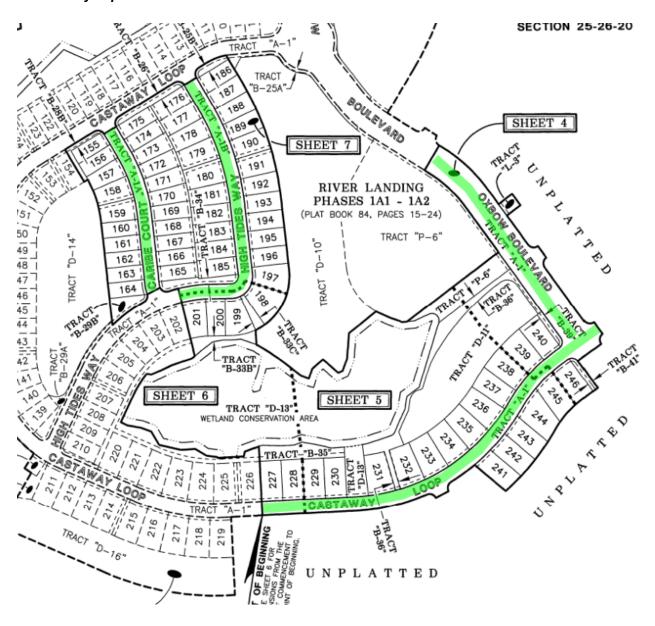

- Real estate rights for the conveyance exist by virtue of platted utility easements in favor of the County.
- Note that the \$921,062.09 worth of Acquired Improvements was constructed by QGS Development, Inc. pursuant to contracts with the Developer, but the Acquired Improvements are only a portion of a larger contracts which involves additional improvements within and without the District's boundaries. Of this amount, \$732,461.34 will be paid immediately and the balance of \$188,600.75 will be paid upon proof of payment by the Developer.
- The District Engineer has identified and certified that the District is paying the correct amount for the work.

RE: Letter Agreement for Acquisition of Public Infrastructure Improvements and Work Product River Landing Phase 1B Utilities

Dear Jim,

Pursuant to the *Acquisition Agreement*, dated August 28, 2020 ("Acquisition Agreement"), you are hereby notified that Taylor Morrison of Florida, Inc. ("Developer") has completed and wishes to sell ("Sale") to the River Landing Community Development District ("District") certain utilities improvements ("Improvements") and related work product ("Work Product"), related to what is known as River Landing Phase 1B and all as described in Exhibit A attached hereto. Subject to the terms of the Acquisition Agreement, the following terms govern the proposed Sale:

- As consideration for the Sale, the District agrees to pay from future bond proceeds the amount of <u>\$921,062.09</u> which represents the actual cost of constructing and/or creating the Improvements and Work Product¹.
- The Developer agrees, at the direction of the District, to assist with the transfer of any permits or similar approvals necessary for the operation of the Improvements.
- The Developer agrees, at the direction of the District, to assist the District with the turnover from the District and to Pasco County all of the District's rights, title and interest in the utility improvements, including but not limited to completing any punch list items at the Developer's expense, warranting any such Improvements to the extent required by Pasco County, and posting and maintaining any required maintenance bonds.
- Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, certain amounts may still be owed to contractors and Developer agrees to timely make payment for all remaining amounts owed, and to ensure that no liens are placed on the Improvements.

As of October 15, 2021, the Developer has paid \$732,461.34 to the Contractor for the Improvements. This amount will be immediately processed by requisition and paid to Developer. The District will process the remaining \$188,600.75 by requisition and pay the Developer once proof of payment for the remaining amount has been submitted to the District, subject to the terms of the Acquisition Agreement and the availability of funds.

If the District is in agreement with the terms stated herein, please execute this letter agreement in the space below and proceed with the necessary steps to effect the Sale.

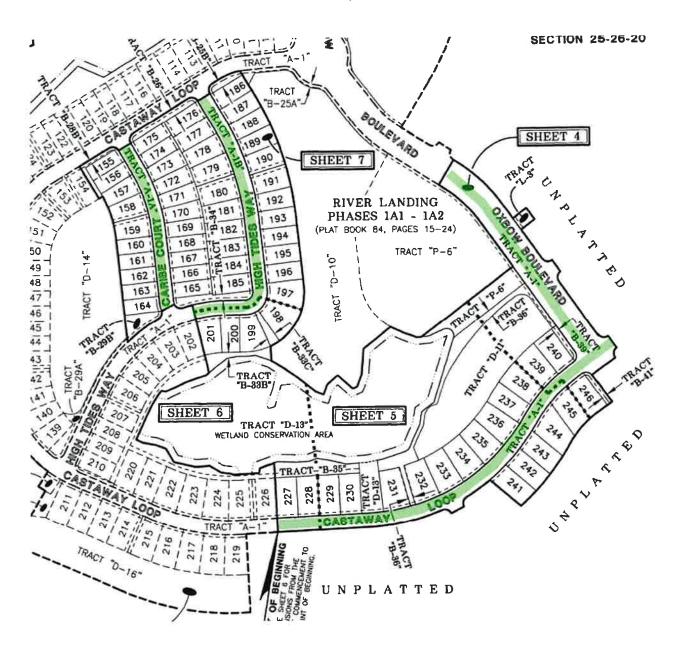

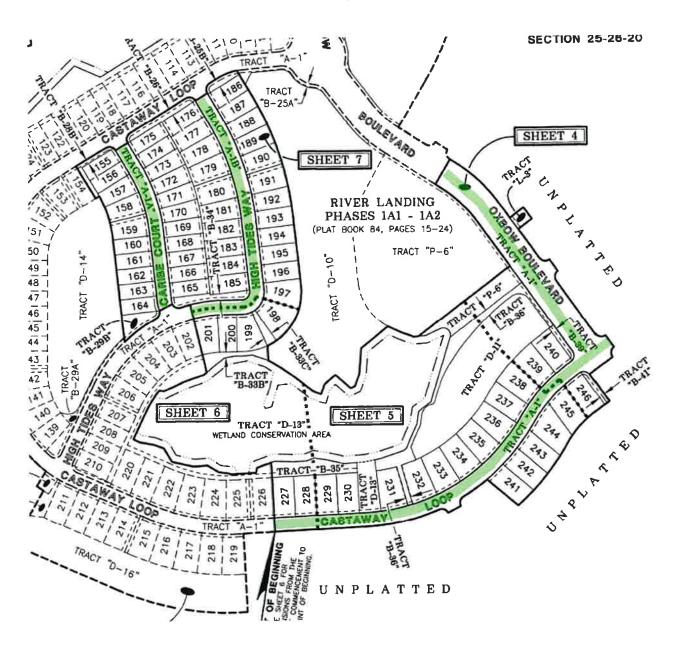

ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND RELEASE (RIVER LANDING PHASE 1B)

THIS ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND RELEASE ("Release") is made the 12th day of October, 2021, by QGS Development, Inc., having offices located at 1450 S. Park Road, Plant City, FL 33566 ("Contractor"), in favor of the River Landing Community Development District ("District"), which is a local unit of special-purpose government situated in Pasco County, Florida, and having offices at c/o James P. Ward, District Manager, JP Ward & Associates, LLC, 2301 NE 37th Street, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida 33308.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, pursuant to that certain agreement ("Contract") dated March 13, 2015 and between Contractor and Taylor Morrison of Florida, Inc., a Florida corporation ("Developer"), Contractor has constructed for Developer certain infrastructure improvements, as described in Exhibit A ("Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, Developer may in the future convey certain Improvements to the District and for that purpose has requested Contractor to confirm the release of all restrictions on the District's right to use and rely upon the Improvements; and

WHEREAS, Contractor has agreed to the release of any such restrictions.

Now, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of mutual promises and obligations, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Contractor provides the following acknowledgment and release:

- **SECTION 1. GENERAL.** The recitals so stated above are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated as a material part of this Release.
- **SECTION 2. ACQUISITION OF IMPROVEMENTS.** Contractor acknowledges that the District is in the process of acquiring or has acquired certain Improvements constructed by Contractor in connection with the Contract, from Developer, and accordingly, the District has the unrestricted right to rely upon the terms of the Contract for same.
- **SECTION 3.** WARRANTY. Contractor hereby expressly acknowledges the District's right to enforce the terms of the Contract, including any warranties provided therein and to rely upon and enforce any other warranties provided under Florida law.
- SECTION 4. CERTIFICATE OF PAYMENT. Except as set forth herein, Contractor hereby acknowledges that it has been fully compensated for its services and work related to completion of the Improvements. Contractor further certifies that, except as set forth herein, no outstanding requests for payment exist related to the Improvements, including any payments to subcontractors, materialmen, suppliers or otherwise, and that there is no disagreement as to the appropriateness of payment made for the Improvements. Except as set forth herein, this document shall constitute a final waiver and release of lien for any payments due to Contractor by Developer or District for the Improvements.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, certain amounts are still owed to Contractor (specifically, \$109,716.16 in balance owed and \$78,884.59 in retainage for the Contract identified in

Exhibit A, which includes a larger scope of improvements than the Improvements being acquired by the District through this acquisition) and Developer has agreed to timely make payment for all remaining amounts owed, and to ensure that no liens are placed on the Improvements. The effectiveness of this Acknowledgment and Release is contingent upon such payment being timely made.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Release shall take effect upon execution.

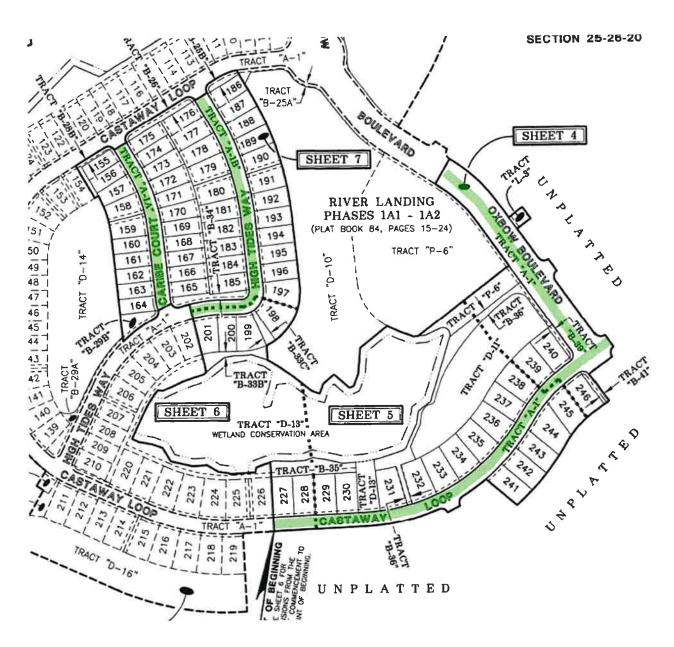

WHEREAS, by virtue of that certain plat recorded in the Public Records of Pasco County, to wit: River Landing Phases 1A1 – 1A2, as recorded in Plat Book 84, Pages 15-24, of the Official Records of Pasco County, Florida ("Phases 1A1 – 1A2 Plat") and River Landing Phases 1A3 – 1A4 – 1A5 – 1A6, as recorded in Plat Book 84, Pages 25-36, of the Official Records of Pasco County, Florida ("Phases 1A3 – 1A4 – 1A5 – 1A6 Plat," and together with Phases 1A1 – 1A2 Plat, "Plats"), Grantor reserved to itself the

right to dedicate and/or dedicated easements to the District over the areas and for the purposes more particularly depicted and described on the Plats; and

WHEREAS, Grantor desires to formally grant to, and/or clarify the terms of, the District easements over the properties being more particularly described herein (collectively, "Easement Areas") for the purposes more particularly described herein; and

WHEREAS, Grantor and District acknowledge that use of the Easement Areas is necessary for District to carry out its essential purpose; and

WHEREAS, the District has requested that Grantor grant to the District a perpetual easement over the Easement Areas and Grantor is agreeable to granting such an easement on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

Now, Therefore, for good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the parties, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- **1. RECITALS.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated as a material part of this Easement Agreement.
- **2. GRANT OF EASEMENT.** Grantor hereby grants to the extent of the Developer's, Community Association's and Townhome Association's respective interests, if any to the District, its successors, and assigns, in perpetuity, non-exclusive easements over, upon, under, through, and across the lands identified below ("**Easement Areas**") to have and to hold the same unto the District, its successors and assigns forever for the following purposes (collectively, "**Easement**"):
 - (a) The District shall have and is hereby granted a perpetual, non-exclusive easement for purposes of ingress and egress, construction, installation, use, maintenance, repair, reconstruction, and replacement by the District of drainage facilities located within Tract A-1 (CDD Drainage, Access & Utility Easement) and Tracts B-20A, B-21, B-25A, B-29A, B-33A (CDD Drainage & Access Easement) of the Phases 1A1 1A2 Plat and Tracts A-2 and A-3 (CDD Drainage, Access and Utility Easement) and Tracts B-1, B-2, B-3, B-5, B-9A, B-9B, B-12, P-3, P-4 and P-5 (CDD Drainage & Access Easement) of the Phases 1A3 1A4 1A5 1A6 Plat.
 - (b) The District shall have and is hereby granted a perpetual, non-exclusive easement for purposes of ingress and egress, construction, installation, use, maintenance, repair, reconstruction, and replacement by the District of drainage facilities located within all drainage easement areas including those labeled "(CDD) Drainage and Access Easements," "(CDD) Side Yard Drainage/Access Easements," "Drainage and Access Easements" and "Drainage, Access and Utility Easements," as identified on the Plats.
- **3. INCONSISTENT USE.** Grantor agrees and covenants that it shall not grant or exercise any rights in the Easement Areas inconsistent with, or which unreasonably interfere with, the rights herein accorded to the District. Further, no permanent improvements shall be placed within Easement Areas that interfere with the rights granted hereunder.

- **4. DEFAULT.** A default by any party under this Easement Agreement shall entitle the other party to all remedies available at law or in equity, which may include but not be limited to the right of actual damages, injunctive relief and/or specific performance.
- **5. ENFORCEMENT OF AGREEMENT.** In the event that either the District or any owner of property upon which the Easement Areas are located seeks to enforce this Easement Agreement by court proceedings or otherwise, then the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover all fees and costs incurred, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs for trial, alternative dispute resolution or appellate proceedings.
- **6. CONTROLLING LAW.** This Easement Agreement shall be construed, interpreted and controlled according to the laws of the State of Florida.
- **7. PUBLIC RECORDS.** Grantor understands and agrees that all documents of any kind provided to the District or to District Staff in connection with this Easement Agreement are public records and are to be treated as such in accordance with Florida law.
- **8. SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Easement Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Easement Agreement, or any part of this Easement Agreement not held to be invalid or unenforceable.
- **9. BINDING EFFECT.** This Easement Agreement and all of the provisions of this Easement Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties set forth herein and their respective successors and permitted assigns, and the agents, employees, invitees, tenants, subtenants, licensees, lessees, mortgagees in possession and independent contractors thereof, as a covenant running with and binding upon the Easement Areas.
- **10. AUTHORIZATION.** By execution below, the undersigned represent that they have been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of their respective entity to execute this Easement Agreement, and that each party has complied with all the requirements of law and has full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.
- **11. AMENDMENTS.** Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this Easement Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by all parties hereto.
- **12. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of the agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Easement Agreement.
- **13. COUNTERPARTS.** This instrument may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which, when executed and delivered, shall constitute an original, and such counterparts together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Signature and acknowledgment pages, if any, may be detached from the counterparts and attached to a single copy of this document to physically form one document.

Subject: Stormwater Management Needs Analysis

(Chapter 2021-194, Laws of Florida/HB53)

We are writing with an update regarding the new law requiring special districts that either own or operate stormwater management systems, stormwater management programs or wastewater services to create a 20-year needs analysis of such system(s).

The Office of Economic and Demographic Research ("OEDR") recently promulgated additional details and an excel template for reporting the stormwater needs analyses (attached hereto for reference). Similar documents for the wastewater needs analyses will be available soon at which time we will again supplement this memorandum.

A brief summary of the new law and its requirements were set forth in our previous memorandum, attached to this memorandum for your reference in **Exhibit A**. Please feel free to contact us with any questions.

When is the deadline?

For both wastewater and stormwater, the first analysis must be submitted by **June 30, 2022** and updated every five (5) years thereafter. The needs analysis, along with the methodology and any supporting data necessary to interpret the results, must be submitted to the county in which the largest portion of the service area or stormwater system is located.

What steps should the District take?

- District engineers should review the stormwater needs analysis excel workbook and submit a work authorization for approval by the District's Board prior to commencing work. We recommend presenting the work authorization to the Board as soon as is practical, but no later than the first quarter of 2022.
- District managers should review the stormwater needs analysis excel workbook and start entering information that is readily available. The district manager may be able to complete the "background information" section and provide data on stormwater O&M expenditures, among other assistance.
- Once the work authorization is approved, the district manager should work with the district engineer to complete the remainder of the stormwater needs analyses with the final version submitted to the District no later than May 15, 2022.



• In some cases, districts may require outside consulting or evaluation to complete the needs analyses. Since the necessity of this additional step may not be immediately apparent, we recommend that district managers begin coordinating with their engineers as soon as possible.

Subject: Wastewater Services and Stormwater Management Needs Analysis

(Chapter 2021-194, Laws of Florida/HB53)

We are writing to inform you of a new law requiring special districts that either own or operate stormwater management systems, stormwater management programs or wastewater services to create a 20-year needs analysis of such system(s). The requirements relating to wastewater services are found in Section 4 of Chapter 2021-194, Laws of Florida, creating Section 403.9301, Florida Statutes, and the requirements relating to stormwater management programs and systems are found in Section 5 of Chapter 2021-194, Laws of Florida, creating Section 403.9302, Florida Statutes (attached hereto for reference).

A brief summary of the new law and its requirements is set forth below. Please feel free to contact us with any questions.

What is required?

The Office of Economic and Demographic Research ("OEDR") is expected to promulgate additional details about the requirements of the needs analyses. However, certain general requirements are set forth in the new law.

For wastewater services, the needs analysis must include:

- a) A detailed description of the facilities used to provide wastewater services.
- b) The number of current and projected connections and residents served calculated in 5-year increments.
- c) The current and projected service area for wastewater services.
- d) The current and projected cost of providing wastewater services calculated in 5-year increments.
- e) The estimated remaining useful life of each facility or its major components.
- f) The most recent 5-year history of annual contributions to, expenditures from, and balances of any capital account for maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components.
- g) The local government's plan to fund the maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components. The plan must include historical and estimated future revenues and expenditures with an evaluation of how the local government expects to close any projected funding gap.

For stormwater management programs and stormwater management systems, the needs analysis must include:

- a) A detailed description of the stormwater management program or stormwater management system and its facilities and projects.
- b) The number of current and projected residents served calculated in 5-year increments.



- c) The current and projected service area for the stormwater management program or stormwater management system.
- d) The current and projected cost of providing services calculated in 5-year increments.
- e) The estimated remaining useful life of each facility or its major components.
- f) The most recent 5-year history of annual contributions to, expenditures from, and balances of any capital account for maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components.
- g) The local government's plan to fund the maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components. The plan must include historical and estimated future revenues and expenditures with an evaluation of how the local government expects to close any projected funding gap.

When is the deadline?

For both wastewater and stormwater, the first analysis must be created by **June 30, 2022**, and the analysis must be updated every five (5) years thereafter. The needs analysis, along with the methodology and any supporting data necessary to interpret the results, must be submitted to the county in which the largest portion of the service area or stormwater system is located.

What steps should districts take?

District engineers and district managers should begin by evaluating what information is already available to the district, and what new information may need to be gathered. Each district should approve a work authorization for their district engineer to create the needs analysis report and should consider proposals for any outside consulting or evaluation that may be necessary, though in most cases we expect this will not be required. In order to provide ample time for completion of the necessary needs analysis reports, we recommend presenting these items for board consideration no later than the first quarter of 2022, or as soon thereafter as is practical. OEDR is anticipated to provide further guidelines for the reporting requirements, none of which we expect to be particularly burdensome, and which will likely include information readily available to districts' engineering and/or environmental professionals. Once we receive further guidance, we will supplement this informational memorandum.

An act relating to public works; amending s. 255.0991, F.S.; revising a prohibition relating to any solicitation for construction services paid for with state appropriated funds; amending s. 255.0992, F.S.; revising the definition of the term "public works project"; prohibiting the state or any political subdivision that contracts for a public works project from taking specified action against certain persons that are engaged in a public works project or have submitted a bid for such a project; providing applicability; amending s. 403.928, F.S.; requiring the Office of Economic and Demographic Research to include an analysis of certain expenditures in its annual assessment; creating s. 403.9301, F.S.; providing definitions; requiring counties, municipalities, and special districts that provide wastewater services to develop a needs analysis that includes certain information by a specified date; requiring municipalities and special districts to submit such analyses to a certain county; requiring the county to file a compiled document with the coordinator of the Office of Economic and Demographic Research by a specified date: requiring the office to evaluate the document and include an analysis in its annual assessment; providing applicability; creating s. 403.9302, F.S.; providing definitions; requiring counties, municipalities, and special districts that provide stormwater management to develop a needs analysis that includes certain information by a specified date: requiring municipalities and special districts to submit such analyses to a certain county; requiring the county to file a compiled document with the Secretary of Environmental Protection and the coordinator of the Office of Economic and Demographic Research by a specified date; requiring the office to evaluate the document and include an analysis in its annual assessment; providing applicability; providing a determination and declaration of important state interest; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 255.0991, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

 $255.0991\,$ Contracts for construction services; prohibited local government preferences.—

(2) For <u>any</u> a competitive solicitation for construction services <u>paid</u> for <u>with any</u> in which 50 percent or more of the cost will be paid from state-appropriated funds which have been appropriated at the time of the competitive solicitation, a state college, county, municipality, school district, or other political subdivision of the state may not use a local ordinance or regulation <u>to prevent</u> a certified, licensed, or registered contractor,

subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier, from participating in the bidding process that provides a preference based upon:

- (a) The contractor's Maintaining an office or place of business within a particular local jurisdiction;
- (b) The contractor's Hiring employees or subcontractors from within a particular local jurisdiction; or
- (c) The contractor's Prior payment of local taxes, assessments, or duties within a particular local jurisdiction.
- Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) and subsections (2) and (3) of section 255.0992, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
 - 255.0992 Public works projects; prohibited governmental actions.—
 - (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (b) "Public works project" means an activity exceeding \$1 million in value that is of which 50 percent or more of the cost will be paid for with any from state-appropriated funds that were appropriated at the time of the competitive solicitation and which consists of the construction, maintenance, repair, renovation, remodeling, or improvement of a building, road, street, sewer, storm drain, water system, site development, irrigation system, reclamation project, gas or electrical distribution system, gas or electrical substation, or other facility, project, or portion thereof that is owned in whole or in part by any political subdivision.
- (2)(a) Except as required by federal or state law, the state or any political subdivision that contracts for a public works project may not take the following actions:
- (a) Prevent a certified, licensed, or registered contractor, subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier, from participating in the bidding process based on the geographic location of the company headquarters or offices of the contractor, subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier submitting a bid on a public works project or the residences of employees of such contractor, subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier.
- (b) Require that a contractor, subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier engaged in a public works such project:
- 1. Pay employees a predetermined amount of wages or prescribe any wage rate;
- 2. Provide employees a specified type, amount, or rate of employee benefits;
 - 3. Control, limit, or expand staffing; or

- 4. Recruit, train, or hire employees from a designated, restricted, or single source.
- (c)(b) The state or any political subdivision that contracts for a public works project may not Prohibit any contractor, subcontractor, or material supplier or carrier able to perform such work that who is qualified, licensed, or certified as required by state or local law to perform such work from receiving information about public works opportunities or from submitting a bid on the public works project. This paragraph does not apply to vendors listed under ss. 287.133 and 287.134.
 - (3) This section does not apply to the following:
 - (a) Contracts executed under chapter 337.
- (b) A use authorized by s. 212.055(1) which is approved by a majority vote of the electorate of the county or by a charter amendment approved by a majority vote of the electorate of the county.
- Section 3. Paragraph (e) is added to subsection (1) of section 403.928, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 403.928 Assessment of water resources and conservation lands.—The Office of Economic and Demographic Research shall conduct an annual assessment of Florida's water resources and conservation lands.
- (1) WATER RESOURCES.—The assessment must include all of the following:
- (e) Beginning with the assessment due January 1, 2022, an analysis of the expenditures necessary to repair, replace, and expand water-related infrastructure. As part of this analysis, the office shall periodically survey public and private utilities.
 - Section 4. Section 403.9301, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 403.9301 Wastewater services projections.—
- (1) The Legislature intends for each county, municipality, or special district providing wastewater services to create a 20-year needs analysis.
 - (2) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Domestic wastewater" has the same meaning as provided in s. 367.021.
- (b) "Facility" means any equipment, structure, or other property, including sewerage systems and treatment works, used to provide wastewater services.
- (c) "Treatment works" has the same meaning as provided in s. 403.031(11).

- (d) "Wastewater services" means service to a sewerage system, as defined in s. 403.031(9), or service to domestic wastewater treatment works.
- (3) By June 30, 2022, and every 5 years thereafter, each county, municipality, or special district providing wastewater services shall develop a needs analysis for its jurisdiction over the subsequent 20 years. In projecting such needs, each local government shall include the following:
- (a) A detailed description of the facilities used to provide wastewater services.
- (b) The number of current and projected connections and residents served calculated in 5-year increments.
 - (c) The current and projected service area for wastewater services.
- (d) The current and projected cost of providing wastewater services calculated in 5-year increments.
- (e) The estimated remaining useful life of each facility or its major components.
- (f) The most recent 5-year history of annual contributions to, expenditures from, and balances of any capital account for maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components.
- (g) The local government's plan to fund the maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components. The plan must include historical and estimated future revenues and expenditures with an evaluation of how the local government expects to close any projected funding gap.
- (4) Upon completing the requirements of subsection (3), each municipality or special district shall submit its needs analysis, as well as the methodology and any supporting data necessary to interpret the results, to the county within which the largest portion of its service area is located. Each county shall compile all analyses submitted to it under this subsection into a single document and include its own analysis in the document. The county shall file the compiled document with the coordinator of the Office of Economic and Demographic Research no later than July 31, 2022, and every 5 years thereafter.
- (5) The Office of Economic and Demographic Research shall evaluate the compiled documents from the counties for the purpose of developing a statewide analysis for inclusion in the assessment due January 1, 2023, pursuant to s. 403.928.
- (6) This section applies to a rural area of opportunity as defined in s. 288.0656 unless the requirements of this section would create an undue economic hardship for the county, municipality, or special district in the rural area of opportunity.

- Section 5. Section 403.9302, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 403.9302 Stormwater management projections.—
- (1) The Legislature intends for each county, municipality, or special district providing a stormwater management program or stormwater management system to create a 20-year needs analysis.
 - (2) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Facility" means any equipment, structure, or other property, including conveyance systems, used or useful in connection with providing a stormwater management program or stormwater management system.
- (b) "Stormwater management program" has the same meaning as provided in s. 403.031(15).
- (c) "Stormwater management system" has the same meaning as provided in s. 403.031(16).
- (3) By June 30, 2022, and every 5 years thereafter, each county, municipality, or special district providing a stormwater management program or stormwater management system shall develop a needs analysis for its jurisdiction over the subsequent 20 years. In projecting such needs, each local government shall include the following:
- (a) A detailed description of the stormwater management program or stormwater management system and its facilities and projects.
- (b) The number of current and projected residents served calculated in 5-year increments.
- (c) The current and projected service area for the stormwater management program or stormwater management system.
- (d) The current and projected cost of providing services calculated in 5-year increments.
- (e) The estimated remaining useful life of each facility or its major components.
- (f) The most recent 5-year history of annual contributions to, expenditures from, and balances of any capital account for maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components.
- (g) The local government's plan to fund the maintenance or expansion of any facility or its major components. The plan must include historical and estimated future revenues and expenditures with an evaluation of how the local government expects to close any projected funding gap.
- (4) Upon completing the requirements of subsection (3), each municipality or special district shall submit its needs analysis, as well as the

methodology and any supporting data necessary to interpret the results, to the county within which the largest portion of its stormwater management program or stormwater management system is located. Each county shall compile all analyses submitted to it under this subsection into a single document and include its own analysis in the document. The county shall file the compiled document with the Secretary of Environmental Protection and the coordinator of the Office of Economic and Demographic Research no later than July 31, 2022, and every 5 years thereafter.

- (5) The Office of Economic and Demographic Research shall evaluate the compiled documents from the counties for the purpose of developing a statewide analysis for inclusion in the assessment due January 1, 2023, pursuant to s. 403.928.
- (6) This section applies to a rural area of opportunity as defined in s. 288.0656 unless the requirements of this section would create an undue economic hardship for the county, municipality, or special district in the rural area of opportunity.
- Section 6. <u>The Legislature determines and declares that this act fulfills an important state interest.</u>

Section 7. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.

INTRODUCTION

As part of the 2021 regular session, the Legislature recognized the need for a long-term planning process for stormwater and wastewater. Section 403.9302, Florida Statutes, requires a 20-year needs analysis from the local governments providing stormwater services. Because this planning document is forward-looking, it will necessarily include a large number of assumptions about future actions. These assumptions should be based on any available information coupled with best professional judgment of the individuals completing the document. Completing this template by June 30, 2022, will fulfill the statutory requirements for the first round of 20-year needs analyses for stormwater. The template was generated by EDR in cooperation with local governments, Special Districts, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), the Water Management Districts, the Florida Stormwater Association, private consultants, and others. Use of this tool will help ensure that information is compiled consistently for the Office of Economic & Demographic Research's (EDR) report to the Legislature.

For the purposes of this document, a stormwater management program and a stormwater management system are as defined in statute (s. 403.031(15) and (16), F.S., respectively; language provided here: https://www.flsenate.gov/Laws/Statutes/2021/403.031). Plainly speaking, the "program" is the institutional framework whereby stormwater management activities (MS4 NPDES permit activities, and other regulatory activities, construction, operation and maintenance, etc.) are carried out by the public authority. The "system" comprises the physical infrastructure that is owned and/or operated by the local government or special district that specifically is intended to control, convey or store stormwater runoff for treatment and flood protection purposes.

For the purposes of this document, the following guiding principles have been adopted:

- Stormwater systems or facilities owned and operated by any of the following are excluded from reporting requirements for local governments and special districts:
 - o Private entities or citizens
 - o Federal government
 - o State government, including the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)
 - o Water Management Districts
 - o School districts
 - o State universities or Florida colleges
- Local government expenditures associated with routine operation and maintenance are fully funded prior to commencing new projects and initiatives.
- Local government submissions will include the activities of dependent special districts. Only independent special districts report separately. For a list of all special districts in the state and their type (i.e., dependent or independent), please see the Department of Economic Opportunity's Official List of Special Districts at the following link: http://specialdistrictreports.floridajobs.org/webreports/alphalist.aspx.
- With respect to federal and state statutes and rulemaking, current law and current administration prevails throughout the 20-year period. In other words, the state's present legal framework (*i.e.*, the status quo) continues throughout the period.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR USING THE TEMPLATE

Instructions for submitting the template are still under development. All expenditures should be reported in \$1,000s (e.g., five hundred thousand dollars should be reported as \$500).

For any jurisdiction that is contracting with another jurisdiction where both could be reporting the same expenditure, please contact EDR for additional guidance. In situations where a reporting jurisdiction contracts with a non-reporting jurisdiction, (i.e., FDOT, the water management districts, the state or federal government), the reporting jurisdiction should include the expenditures.

When reporting cost information, please only include the expenditures that have flowed, are flowing, or will likely flow through your jurisdiction's budget. While necessary to comply with the statute, the concept of "future expenditures" should be viewed as an expression of identified needs.

INTRODUCTION

As part of the 2021 regular session, the Legislature recognized the need for a long-term planning process for stormwater and wastewater. Section 403.9302, Florida Statutes, requires a 20-year needs analysis from the local governments providing stormwater services. Because this planning document is forward-looking, it will necessarily include a large number of assumptions about future actions. These assumptions should be based on any available information coupled with best professional judgment of the individuals completing the document.

Completing this template by June 30, 2022, will fulfill the statutory requirements for the first round of 20-year needs analyses for stormwater. The template was generated by EDR in cooperation with local governments, Special Districts, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), the Water Management Districts, the Florida Stormwater Association, private consultants, and others. Use of this tool will help ensure that information is compiled consistently for the Office of Economic & Demographic Research's (EDR) report to the Legislature.

For the purposes of this document, a stormwater management program and a stormwater management system are as defined in statute (s. 403.031(15) and (16), F.S., respectively; language provided here: https://www.flsenate.gov/Laws/Statutes/2021/403.031). Plainly speaking, the "program" is the institutional framework whereby stormwater management activities (MS4 NPDES permit activities, and other regulatory activities, construction, operation and maintenance, etc.) are carried out by the public authority. The "system" comprises the physical infrastructure that is owned and/or operated by the local government or special district that specifically is intended to control, convey or store stormwater runoff for treatment and flood protection purposes.

For the purposes of this document, the following guiding principles have been adopted:

- Stormwater systems or facilities owned and operated by any of the following are excluded from reporting requirements for local governments and special districts:
 - o Private entities or citizens
 - o Federal government
 - o State government, including the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)
 - o Water Management Districts
 - o School districts
 - o State universities or Florida colleges
- Local government expenditures associated with routine operation and maintenance are fully funded prior to commencing new projects and initiatives.
- Local government submissions will include the activities of dependent special districts. Only independent special districts report separately. For a list of all special districts in the state and their type (*i.e.*, dependent or independent), please see the Department of Economic Opportunity's Official List of Special Districts at the following link: http://specialdistrictreports.floridajobs.org/webreports/alphalist.aspx.
- With respect to federal and state statutes and rulemaking, current law and current administration prevails throughout the 20-year period. In other words, the state's present legal framework (*i.e.*, the status quo) continues throughout the period.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR USING THE TEMPLATE

Instructions for submitting the template are still under development. The statutory language forms the titles for each part. This template asks that you group your recent and projected expenditures in prescribed categories. A detailed list of the categories is provided in part 5.0.

The same project should not appear on multiple tables in the jurisdiction's response unless the project's expenditures are allocated between those tables. All expenditures should be reported in \$1,000s (e.g., five hundred thousand dollars should be reported as \$500).

For any jurisdiction that is contracting with another jurisdiction where both could be reporting the same expenditure, please contact EDR for additional guidance. In situations where a reporting jurisdiction contracts with a non-reporting jurisdiction, (*i.e.*, FDOT, the water management districts, the state or federal government), the reporting jurisdiction should include the expenditures.

When reporting cost information, please only include the expenditures that have flowed, are flowing, or will likely flow through your jurisdiction's budget. While necessary to comply with the statute, the concept of "future expenditures" should be viewed as an expression of identified needs.

These projections are necessarily speculative and do not represent a firm commitment to future budget actions by the jurisdiction.

This Excel workbook contains three worksheets for data entry. (Along the bottom of the screen, the three tabs are highlighted green.) Empty cells with visible borders are unlocked for data entry. In the first tab, titled "Background through Part 4," the information requested is either text, a dropdown list (e.g., Yes or No), or a checkbox. The next tab, "Part 5 through Part 8," contains tables for expenditure or revenue data as well as some follow-up questions that may have checkboxes, lists, or space for text.

In Part 5 and Part 6, the expenditure tables have space for up to 5 projects. More projects can be listed in the "Additional Projects" tab. This tab contains a table with space for up to 200 additional projects. In order for these additional projects and expenditures to be correctly classified and included in the final totals, each project must be assigned a Project Type and Funding Source Type the from the dropdown lists in columns B and C.
